Fighting for Alyssa depends exclusively on donations, fundraisers and volunteers in order to gift grants to local foundations and facilities. With more than 50 volunteers supporting FFA yearly, we have raised more than **\$250,000** since being founded in 2015.

Over **\$500,000** has been pledged in the next 5 years and by year end more than approximately **\$200,000** will be granted out!
